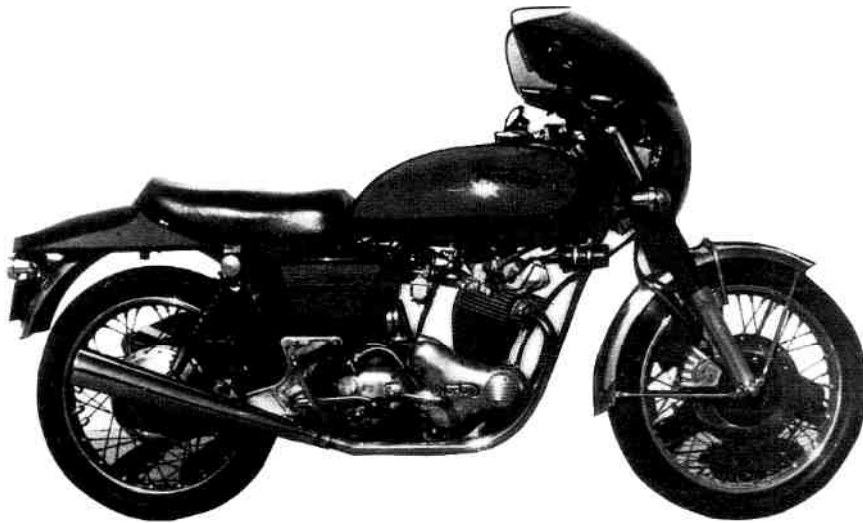

FEATURE BIKE

Here's an interesting combination of parts and ideas belonging to Tom Borman, the fellow who handles the branch's pins, badges, and T-shirts. The Interstate tank was picked for its usefull range and the Fastback seat and tail fairing plus the BMW /S fairing were picked for looks. Tom calls the bike his Inter-back. The fairing, tank, side covers and tail fairing were painted in bright red and black lacquer with a finish coat of Imron for protection by Scot Marburger.

The bike is a '74 850 with a basically stock engine, with the exception of an engine rebalance and a ported and flowed head. It has a Boyer transistorized ignition and a single Mikuni carburetor in this photo, although Tom has a pair of Amal MKII carbs that he plans to install very soon. Some other nice touches are the use of steel braided oil lines throughout, a drilled front brake, a stainless steel fork brace, adjustable Koni shocks with progressive rate 90/145 lb. springs, a Hella quartz 55/100 watt headlight (with the Lucas 3-phase alternator kit), and Albert bar end mirrors. Avon Roadrunner tires are installed front and rear. The bike has 47,000 miles on it and was totally rebuilt last winter.

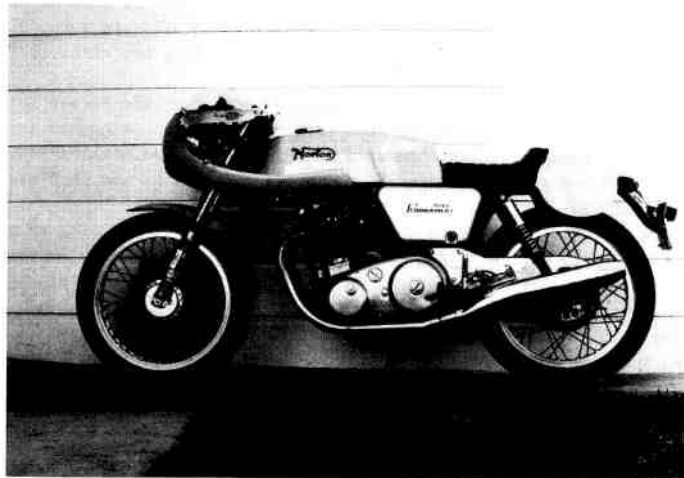

BREAKING - IN PROCEDURE

At the time of introduction of the 850 model Commando, the preferred engine lubricant recommendations were changed from multi-grade oils to heavy duty monogrades. (see service release N3/59)

The piston ring bedding pattern achieved with heavy duty monograde engine oils is ultimately superior than with multi-grades, and thus provides longer piston ring and cylinder bore life. However, it has been found that full bedding of the piston ring/cylinder wall combination is not fully achieved until 1200 miles have been completed, and hence normal economical oil consumption cannot be expected until that mileage.

CORRECT INSTALLATION OF ZENER DIODE

With the higher electrical output now being achieved from the motorcycle alternator, the zener diode is required to dissipate increased excess charging current than previously when running with no lighting load and a fully charged battery.

The existing zener diode (Lucas No. 49345) is perfectly capable of dealing with the additional load, provided the diode body is seated perfectly onto the footrest hanger plate, which functions as the heat sink.

When fitting or replacing a zener diode at any time, apply a thin smear of silicone compound to the mating surfaces to ensure full area heat transference.

Suitable silicone compounds specifically designed to meet this function are readily available from television repair shops. Two readily available compounds are:

1. G.E. Electronic Silicone Compound transistor Z-5 No. 8101
2. G.E. Silicone Compound G-640 or G-641

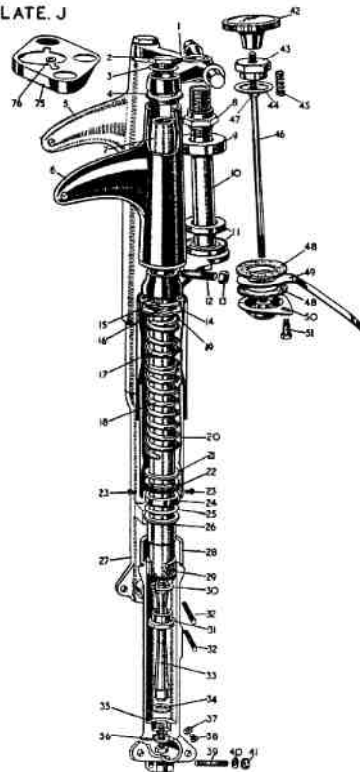
