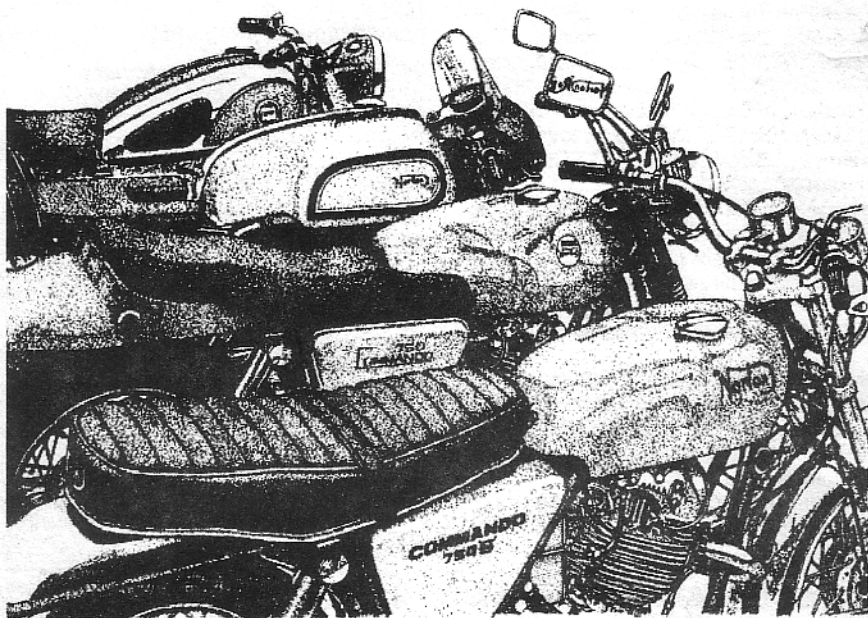

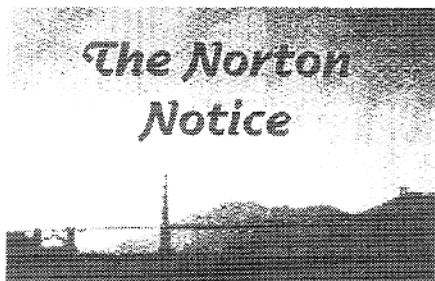

Rider's Ride

This month we are featuring Jerry Kaplan and his 1970, fire flake purple, Commando Roadster. As most of you know, Jerry is one of the founding members of the Northern California Norton Owners Club and, with the brief exception of a couple of years ago, Jerry has been a continuous Norton Owner since 1968.

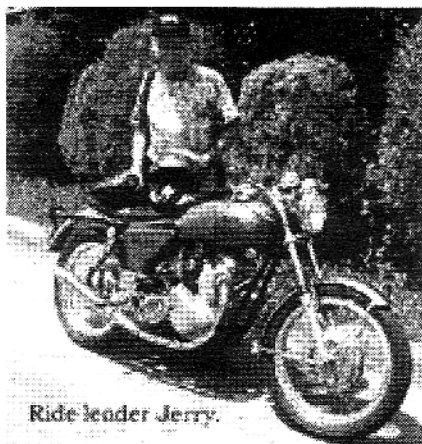
Jerry acquired this bike in 1998, after a 1997 fire in his garage rendered him Nortonless. After rebuilding his garage, Jerry turned his attention to getting another Norton. He found this one, in pretty rough and non-running condition, not far from home.

Jerry set about rebuilding the Roadster and in the process did a complete tear down and inspection. Much of the chrome needed replating or replacement. The upper end of the engine needed lots of work to correct a frozen rocker, pistons and cylinders that were badly scuffed, and pushrods that had been ruined. The rotor and stator were AWOL. The only bit of good luck he had was that the purple paint on the tank and side covers was in good shape.

After selling off some of the parts he didn't want, and parting with a bunch of money for parts he did want, Jerry put together a nice bike. It currently rolls on flanged alloy wheels and Super Venom tires. Bub mufflers make it sound good and a Boyer ignition makes it run good. It steers via a set of swan style clip-ons from Unity Equipe in the U.K.

Jerry is pleased with the results and, for those of you that missed the North Bay Ride in June, I can vouch for the fact that it goes fast and corners with the best of them. I have a special interest in this bike because I too have a bright coloured '70 Roadster. Unfortunately, mine is semi-retired, while Jerry's is living a new life.

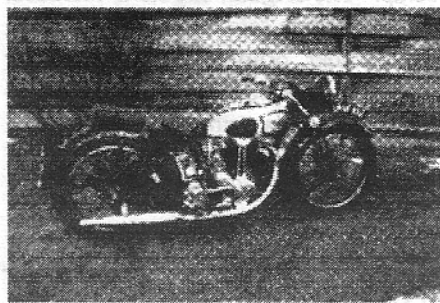
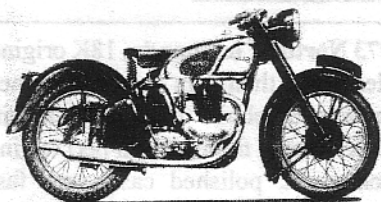
Four Stroke Singles National Owners Club Annual Rally

Gold hunting, superb scenery, and a great variety of single cylinder motorcycles from all reaches of the US and beyond combine in Jackson, California during **Sept. 12-14**, as FSSNOC members meet in the Golden State's Mother Lode. Jackson, along the famous Highway 49, is centrally located in the gold rush country. East-coast riders will enter Ca through Reno, up Donner Pass or around Lake Tahoe; or through Las Vegas, across the Mojave Desert (Death Valley), then up the eastern flanks of the Sierra Mountains past Yosemite National Park. Jackson rests in the foothill country below the towering high Sierras and once supported two of the deepest hard rock mines on earth. Roads wind from there to limestone caverns, a winery displaying an enormous nugget, groves of giant Sequoias, the original roundhouse and ships of the steam 1897 Sierra Railroad, an 1873 and still operating water powered foundry, an abundance of mines and 150 year old architecture, relics, and history. Single cylinder bikes are preferred, but all number of lungs is welcome. Must be a club member for the discount room rate and to participate in the activities (membership is cheap). Rally events include prizes of gold pans and local gold for various classifications of motorcycles, **including a special category for past and present British machines**. Progressive Suspension In., USA will be donating an attractive array of door prizes and presenting a seminar on motorcycle suspension. A club brunch and banquet are planned, along with a local speaker to introduce us to the area, and lots of time for exploration. This starts right out the door of rally headquarter, the Jackson Amador Best Western Inn (800-543-5221 for special-rate room information). Downtown Jackson is right next door with all manner of ships and restaurants. Seven miles up Hwy 88 is roaring Camp, an old 49'er fold camp that offers cabins and camping (209-296-4100). Another nearby spot, Indian Grinding Rock State Park offer camping on a first-come basis alongside the largest grouping of native American grinding holes in the nation. 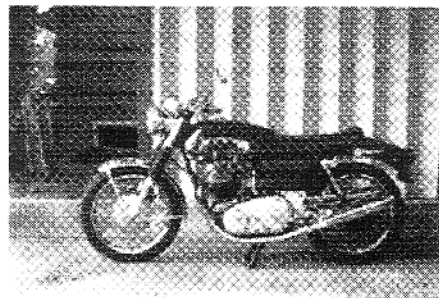

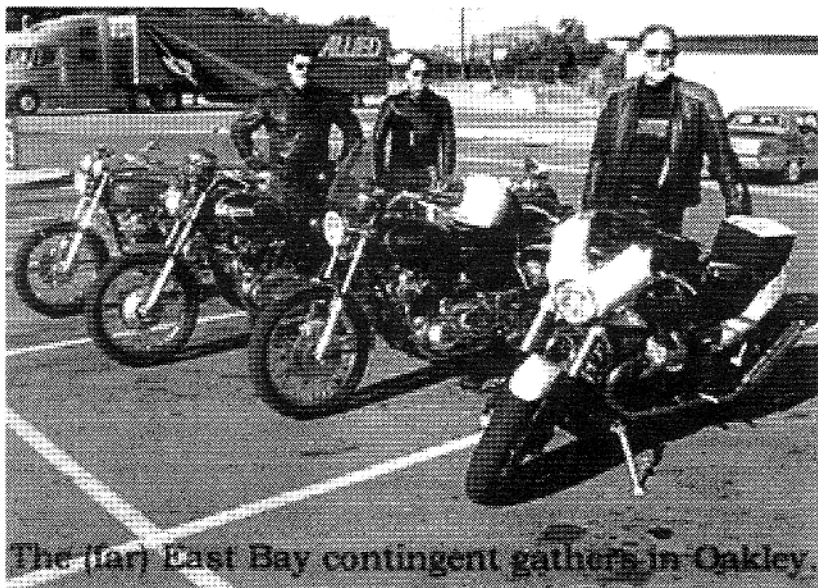
