Dues, therefore, will not be raised in the near future and Harvey hinted that we might be able to have an extra special Christmas party this year.

Steve Coburn announced the Classic Sports Racing Group's upcoming race at Sears Point September 20. Anyone interested in details can contact Steve or Norton Notice. Steve then treated everyone to a slide show of the beer Bust and Bass Lake Rally to finish up the meeting.

# PRESIDENTIAL RAMBLINGS

I hate to start "Ramblings" on a sad note this month, but that's the way it is. Dick Rutter, an active club member from Alameda was seriously injured during the "Old Timer's" ride last month. We were about a half mile from the end of the ride on Hwy. 84 when a kid on an old Suzuki 750 two-stroke came flying down from Skylonda, out of control, on the wrong side of the road, and ran head on into Dick before he had a chance to take evasive action. Dick was riding one of Mike Rettie's fine old ES2s which was totaled. Dick suffered a compound fracture of the left leg with at least three broken bones. He's at Stanford Medical Center now in surgical intensive care but will probably be moved to an Alameda hospital by the time you read this. The other guy was unhurt. On a more cheery note, the "Old Timer's" ride was a resounding success with about forty Norts showing up, half of which were pre-Commandos. Among the notables were Ed Brooks on his beautiful '57 Nomad Scrambler, Jan Barton on his Gardengate Manx, yours truly on a ratty but fun '51 500T trials machine, Mike Rettie with his pair of ES2s, and a host of others from the 60's. However, the bike that stole the show, the most inspiring, immaculate, beautiful, and oldest machine there was Art Sirota's '47 Model 18, our centerfold bike for this month.

Art has simply done a superb job on the restoration of this machine. It just exudes quality, character, and class. I was so impressed by this machine that I asked Art if he would give a little restoration workshop to tell us how he did it. He would use the Model 18 as a basis for describing all the techniques and resources required for restoring a classic Norton. Fortunately Art agreed, so stay tuned for details.

I think we have found a home in the South Peninsula area -- Rick's Swiss Chalet in Palo Alto. We had another giant turnout of over fifty people and there was more than enough room to accomoodate everyone. The atmosphere was nice, we had our own bartendress, and they bought a couple of cases of Bass Ale just for the Norton Club. I have reserved the same room for our October 8 and December 10 meetings, so we will have our Christmas party at Rick's this year.

#### SEPTEMBER MEETING AND RIDE: LAKE TAHOE OVERNITE

Our next meeting will be at the Edinburgh Castle in the City, and the ride will start from the Ferry Landing in downtown Saucalito. This will be an overnighter, but as usual, the first days ride will be laid out so that those who don't want to spend the night can ride on Saturday like it was a regular one day club ride.

Our ride will start on Saturday morning from Saucalito then wind on up north through the Wine Country up to Clear Lake then through a scenic backroads way across the Vally to Grass Vally where we'll head north on 49 across Yuba Pass , then down to Lake Tahoe for a night in a nice warm motel at the Northshore area. The next day we'll head around the East side of the Lake, down into Nevada, then back home across Ebbett's Pass to Stockton and the Bay Area. If you want to trace out the route on a map (it's the best way), these are the Highway numbers to follow: 101,37,121,12, over to Calistoga, then 29, 53, &20 to Grass Valley, then 49, 89, 267, 28, 19, 395, 88, 89, 4, 99, 205, 580, then home.

We will get to Tahoe before dark and should have plenty of time for dinner and perhaps a little gambling or other Lake Tahoe recreational activities before turning in for the night. Sunday's ride will be a little shorter and we should be back in the Bay Area by 6 PM. This ride avoids the boring freeways that cross the Central Valley and passes through some of the most scenic parts of the Sierras.

I'm going to take a chance that most of you would rather spend 7 or 8 bucks for a nice, clean, warm motel room with all the modern conveniences than sleep out on the cold, hard, early Fall Sierra ground. Therefore I'm resering a place in the North Tahoe area that will sleep 15 people. This means you don't have to worry about bringing tents or other cool outdoorsy stuff. Also, we can lock our valuables



inside when we go out to eat and play. It's our last overnighter until next summer, so don't miss it. Oh,yes; there will be clearly marked maps for those who worry about getting lost.

Steve Coburn showed slides of the Beer Bust and Bass Lake Rally which turned out to be the hit of the evening. It's amazing how many witty comments can come from the mouths of the "very slightly" inebriated. It should be easy to find the meeting places now; every even month will be at Rick's Swiss Chalet in Palo Alto, and every odd month will be at the Edinburgh Castle in San Francisco.

Thinking of San Francisco, I feel like we have been neglecting our brethren in and around the City by not having as many activities in that area as we should have. The schedule over the next few months should go a long way toward rectifying that problem. The meetings will be in the City in September, November, and January, and the Sept., Oct., and Dec. rides will be in that area.

#### Suggestion of the Month?

I shudder every time I see an uncovered open quart of oil (that the owner intends to use later) sitting in someone's garage. I have yet to see any engine that likes dirt, dust, animal hair, sawdust, etc. A simple and airtight cover can be obtained from a one pound coffee can or similar can used for Crisco shortening, shelled nuts, and other perishable foods. Some of these plastic snap-on covers are the same diameter (4") as a quart of oil. Besides keeping impurities out of your favorite liquid lubricant (next to beer, that is), they also keep the oil in after you've kicked the can over while wrestling with the sump plug of you engine in the course of an oil change. I would, however, hesitate to rely on one of these snap-on lids while going on a bike trip. A plastic pint bottle with a good screw-on cap such as shampoo or fork oil comes in does much better at keeping your excess engine oil away from your last pair of clean socks at the bottom of your saddlebags. And with a British bike, who wants saddlebags that leak oil? gene autin



Art has received much-deserved praise for his work and is being encouraged to give a restoration seminar at the October meeting.







A total of eleven pre-Commandos arrived for the ride - Atlas, Manx, ES2, and others were there in force and well-represented the marque.




Harvey's N15 - well cared for and a very good runner.






